LEARNING OBJECTIVES FOR EACH MODULE:

**Trans and gender diverse primary care (November 2)**

*Recommended audience:* physicians, nurse practitioners, and other health care professionals

*Learning objectives include:*

- initiating and monitoring hormone prescribing;
- completing assessment, monitoring, and follow-up for hormone therapy;
- utilizing local clinical guidelines to inform and guide practice;
- ongoing preventative care for trans and gender diverse clients; and
- providing holistic community-based transition-related services to trans and gender-diverse clients.

**Transition-related surgeries: Planning, referral, and care (November 9)**

*Recommended audience:* primarily for service providers who can play a role in the surgical referral process in Ontario, including Registered Social Workers, Registered Nurses, Nurse Practitioners, Psychologists, and Physicians.

- understanding recent regulatory context and the current process of surgical referral;
- understanding risks and pre- and post-op considerations for 7 funded procedures;
- planning for successful surgeries with trans and gender diverse people;

- supporting clients holistically throughout the referral process.
