

Family Physician (Addiction Medicine) Opportunities

The Queen's University Department of Family Medicine (DFM) is recruiting family physicians with expertise in addiction medicine.

The responsibilities include a combination of clinical care with an inpatient addiction consultation service and outpatient rapid access addiction medicine clinic at the Kingston Health Sciences Centre (KHSC); integration of addiction medicine within primary care; and clinical teaching at undergraduate and postgraduate levels. Depending on candidates' interests, this opportunity can incorporate research. Successful candidates will collaborate with multidisciplinary teams including clinicians from psychiatry, internal medicine, emergency medicine, family medicine, nursing, and allied health. Together, these teams will work closely with community partners in improving care for patients with substance use disorders in the hospital and community.

Applicants must be eligible for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario before the appointment start date. All applicants must hold current, valid certification (or equivalent) in family medicine from the College of Family Physicians of Canada. Preference will be given to applicants holding a Certificate of Added Competence in Addiction Medicine from the College of Family Physicians of Canada.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is committed to employment equity and diversity in the workplace and welcomes applications from women, racialized/visible minorities, Indigenous/Aboriginal peoples, persons with disabilities, and LGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.

To comply with federal laws, the University is obliged to gather statistical information as to how many applicants for each job vacancy are Canadian citizens / permanent residents of Canada. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: "I am a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada"; OR, "I am not a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada". Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant's accessibility needs.
