**Job Title:** Post-Doctoral Fellow in Indigenous Health, Full-time

**Description of Area or Topic of Research:** The Department of Family Medicine and Centre for Studies in Primary Care at Queen's University is inviting applications for a full-time post-doctoral fellowship in Indigenous health under the supervision of clinician-scientists Dr. Amrita Roy and Dr. Michael Green. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to contribute to collaborative, community-engaged (centered in the principles of Ownership, Control, Access, Possession) Indigenous health research in the areas of health systems and policy, population health (including, but not limited to, maternal-child health), primary care, and medical education. The successful candidate will have extensive opportunities in this role to participate in academic publications, grant submissions, mentorship and supervision of junior research trainees, and other academic career skills development.

- Recent (last 5 years) graduate of a relevant PhD program in health or social sciences, with methodological training and strong skills in mixed- and multiple-methods research (ideally comfortable with both qualitative and quantitative research methods). Will consider strong applicants with a soon-to-be completed PhD with confirmed timeline for defence.
- Experience with NVivo software for qualitative analysis, and one or more statistical software (e.g. Stata, SAS, R, etc.) for quantitative analysis.
- Strong academic writing skills; an established publication record is an asset.
- Ability to work independently, set goals and work effectively towards deadlines, and collaborate meaningfully and respectfully with both community partners and academic team members alike.
- Interest in community-engaged Indigenous health scholarship; previous experience in Indigenous health and/or health equity and/or community-based participatory research approaches is an asset.
